
100 years of female Fellows

Lyell Meeting 2019 - student registration just £20

On 28 June the Lyell Meeting, the Society's flagship event for UK Palaeontology, will focus on *Carbon: Geochemical and palaeobiological perspectives*.

Traditionally, biological and chemical approaches to understanding carbon dynamics in the geological past have been considered in relative isolation. This meeting will bring together a broad spectrum of scientists to address the big picture of carbon in the Earth system, drawing on expertise in palaeontology, geochemistry, palaeobotany, atmospheric processes, deep-Earth processes, and anthropogenic impacts.


